1 MASTERS RIDERS CATEGORIES

Daily licenses are not accepted, for participation at the UCI Masters Cyclo-Cross World Championships. (See article UCI 5.4.001.)

5.4.004

The championships are organized in 5 years age groups: 35-39, 40-44, etc. Age groups will be combined when less than 6 riders enter an age group. In case of combined age, title for the respective 5 years age groups will be awarded (even when only 1 rider is entered.)

2 COMPETITORS SELECTION

Each rider respecting the standards of points 1 and 3 may entry the 2022 UCI Masters Cyclo-Cross World Championships under his/her own responsibility. There is no maximum quota per Nation. The registration is individual.

3 RULES

3.1 PARTICIPATION IN UCI MASTERS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

5.1.001

The category which will be applied for entries to races for the entire season is the category to which the rider will belong on 1 January of the following calendar years.

Masters:

All riders aged 35 and over may ride in the masters world championships. However, the following riders are not eligible:

- **1.** Any rider who has ridden in the UCI cyclo-cross world championships, continental championships or UCI cyclo-cross world cup during the current year.
- **2.** Any rider who has been a member, during the current cyclo-cross season, of a team registered with the UCI.
- **3.** Any rider classified with at least 100 points in the UCI individual cyclo-cross ranking published after the first UCI cyclo-cross world cup event of the current cyclo-cross season.

5.4.001

Only license holders under articles 1.1.001 to 1.1.028 and 5.1.001 may take part in the masters world championships. A race number is only issued on presentation of the license.

3.2 EQUIPMENT

5.4.002

The riders taking part in the masters world championships represent their country, but are permitted to use equipment of their choice.

1.3.012

A bicycle shall not measure more than 185 cm in length and 50 cm in width overall.

1.3.018

For the Cyclo-cross bicycle the width of the tyre (measured between the widest parts) shall not exceed 33 mm and it may not incorporate any form of spike or stud.

1.3.025

Disc brakes are allowed in cyclo-cross training and competition.

For races on the road and cyclo-cross, the use of fixed sprocket is forbidden: a braking system that acts on both wheels is required.

1.3.031

Wearing a rigid safety helmet shall be mandatory during competitions and training sessions.

4 RIDERS REGISTRATION AND ACCREDITATION

4.1 ONLINE REGISTRATION

How?

Through the website worldmasterscx.co.uk page ENTRIES. Only internet registrations received by midnight (GMT) on Monday 14th November are valid, **no last-minute registration on site will be accepted.**

All races are limited to a maximum of 150 riders. A system of waiting list is organised in order to manage a high demand and a fair and even distribution per nation. Thus, the entry confirmation will be sent to the requesting riders afterwards.

When?

The online system opened on the 01/08/2022. Entries are now closed.

4.2 RIDERS CONFIRMATION AT THE VENUE

What?

All riders must show up at the time of the rider's confirmation to ensure their participation.

The license check by commissaires is mandatory. All riders must have a valid racing licence with a UCI Code.

The riders will receive Accreditation and Pit Passes when they pick up their numbers.

5 START ORDER / RACE NUMBERS

5.1 START ORDER

The start order will be made for each category by drawing lot following the process as directed by the UCI and supervised by Race Director Mr Ian Poole

5.2 RACE NUMBERS

The race number will be attributed by the Organization committee of the 2022 UCI Masters Cyclo-cross World Championships.

5.3 START PROCEDURES

Riders should report to the Call-Up Area no later than 15 minutes before the start of their race in order for the Jury to undertake clothing and machine compliance checks.

Where mixed categories have the same start time, please proceed to the call-up area allocated to your category.



6 TRAINING SESSIONS

Only riders that have an accepted entry are allowed to participate in Training Sessions and in accordance with the times published in the Race Schedule.

Entry to the course for training shall only be from the Course Entry Point indicated on the Course Map.

 \dots / \dots The World Champion, as well as the second and the third placed riders shall be ready for the official ceremony that shall be conducted under the responsibility of the president of the commissaries panel.

9.1.046

Riders shall appear in racing attire.

The first three riders receive gold, silver and bronze medals, following article 5.4.004.



The UCI Masters Cyclo-Cross World Champion jersey is **to be worn during masters cyclo-cross races** of the corresponding category only.



Wearing this jersey during other category's or discipline races is forbidden and may be punish with a fine of 2.000 CHF (UCI article 1.3.072).

Getting to Trinity Park

By Air

London Stansted is only 50 miles from Ipswich. Coachlink offer an hourly service to Colchester Railway Station with frequent rail connections to Ipswich. National Express Coaches offer travel from Stansted to Ipswich via connections from Heathrow and Gatwick airports. Norwich Airport is easily reached from Ipswich. Norwich is approximately an hour away by car and has regular train connections.

Airport transfers

By Sea

Stena Line operates a twice-daily service to Harwich (only 32 miles from Ipswich) from the Hook of Holland. Regular services to Harwich, from Esbjerg are operated by DFDS Seaways.

By Car

The major trunk roads leading to Ipswich are the A12 from London and the South, and the A14 from the Midlands and the North.

By Rail

Trains from London Liverpool Street reach Ipswich in just over an hour. The main East Coastline (serving the North of England and Scotland) regularly connects with an Ipswich service at Peterborough.

By Bicycle

Peaceful lanes and gently undulating countryside make Ipswich and the district perfect terrain for cycling. Cycle routes along many Ipswich roads make reaching the town centre easy. The Ipswich Cycle Route Map is available from Ipswich Tourist Information Centre.


Off-site Parking

16 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Neutral Service

The Organisation is providing a Neutral Service station next to the Equipment Pit / Start area. This Service is provided at no cost to competitors, but any replacement parts used is chargeable.

Tyre Checks

Commissaires will be available during practice to check tyres and make sure they comply with the UCI width regulations.

Power washing

There are 3 Bike Wash Areas in operation. Water is available from various locations around the venue. It is not necessary to bring water to the event.

Bike Wash 1 – This is a Kärcher power wash provided by Hope Technology and manned by the organisation

Bike Wash 2 – In this area it is permitted for riders to use their own washing equipment. Bike Wash Area 2 may only be used during the duration of the race of the individual Rider.

Bike Wash 3 – In this area Riders may use their own equipment to wash bikes during Practice, Training and outside of their individual race times.

Pit Accreditation

All riders will be issued with 2 Pit Passes labelled exclusively for their race. Access to the pit area is not allowed at any other time.

On Site Camping

Overnight camping for motorhomes is provided on site, all vehicles must pre book via the event website for insurance purposes – Drinking Water, Toilets and Waste water disposal is provided on site. Electric hook up is not available. Silent generators are permitted. No noise or music may be played after 21.00pm.

Limited showering facilities are available in the main toilet / changing block in the Arena. Further showering facilities are available elsewhere on-site. Please enquire at Registration for further details.

Mixed Category Races

Where more than one category is racing at the same time, starts will be split with the youngest category starting first with a minimum of 30 seconds between categories

Medal Ceremony

This takes place each day after all races have been completed in accordance with the Race Schedule – it is a requirement in accordance to the regulations of the UCI for the top 3 riders in each age category to be present.

Warm-up Tent

Feedback Sports will provide a complimentary warm-up tent during the 3 days of racing.


The large tent is located near the race HQ, finish line and food vendors.
